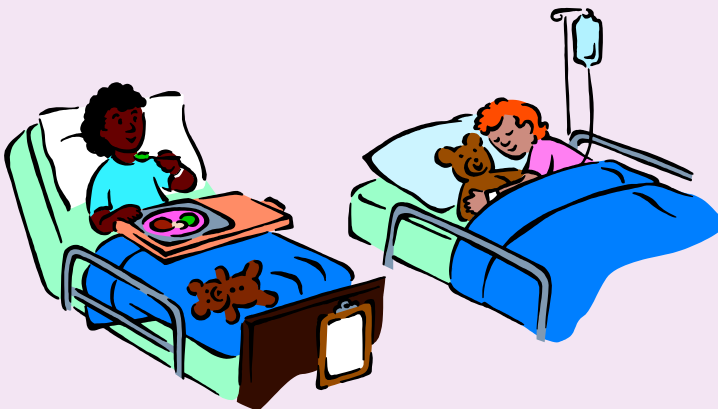


"We need a fourth for poker," said the friend.
