## X-Ray

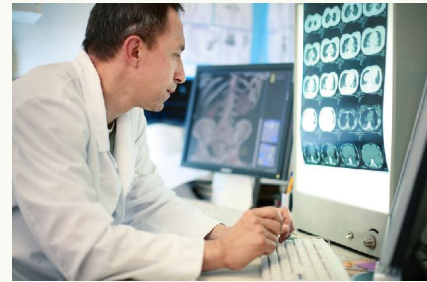
Some of the CVMG staff may not know we purchased a “Digital X-Ray System” in the new SF Building. This means that the x-rays are not on film, but on the computer. This allows the providers to look at the x-ray in a clearer image and on their computers. There are larger monitors in order to examine the x-rays closer up if needed.

Art City Medical installed a “digitizer” which will also allow our film x-rays to be digitized and seen on the computers.

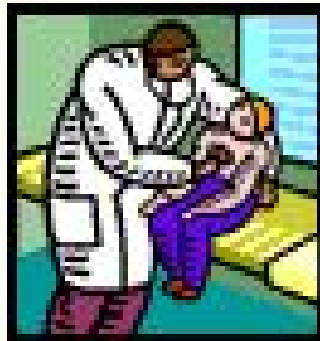


With these two systems the providers should be able to send to the hospital any x-rays they feel need over-reading (double checking) by the radiologist. This should happen quicker and be more accurate.
